Nottingham City Council is planning to improve your road

We are resurfacing Glasshouse Street. Work will begin on 2nd March until 26th March 2026. Hours of work will be 8pm to 6am, Monday to Friday. Please see information below and diversion plan overleaf.

How will this affect you?

Glasshouse Street will be closed to all traffic with a diversion route in place. If you are travelling to the Victoria Centre, please plan your journey ahead and use the car park off Woodborough Road. If you need to use the Glasshouse Street entrance the following exemptions will be in place:

Access to Victoria Centre Car Park (from Glasshouse Street entrance)

- From 8pm to 10pm you will still be able to access the car park from Glasshouse Street. Exit will be via Howard Street. You will be escorted through the traffic management by a Traffic Safety Officer.
- From 10pm to 6am you will still be able to access the car park via a route which uses Rick Street from Huntington Street end. Exit will be via Howard Street. You will be escorted through the traffic management by a Traffic Safety Officer.
- On 12th, 18th & 19th March, Lower Parliament Street will also have a road closure in place at the junction with Glasshouse Street. During these shifts, traffic from George Street will be left turn only on to Lower Parliament Street and use the diversion of Milton Street and Woodborough Road.
